The body colour often has a creamy appearance with a silver iridescence. Frosting will be present on main & tail.



* **DJEMUR LETICIA:** Buckskin with Golden Overlay

Overlay: (also known as sooty, burnt) This diffuse colouring is caused

by brown overlay of colour on the base of a golden buckskin. It is a deep & strong colour with very dark legs & main & tail almost resembling sunburnt colouring. This colouring also displays strong dorsal stripe, leg bars, neck shadowing & often a face mask. The body colour often shows a copper iridescence.

Black: Off black, rusty or slate all over. The dilute black is the darkest ember of the buckskin family. It is often referred to as 'Smokey or brown buckskins. To deter-

What is a Buckskin?

BUCKSKIN– A true coloured buckskin is a single dilute colour. The shades of buckskins that can be identified are..

Cream: Off white with a slight golden tint with black points.

Standard: A deep gold colour with a iridescence to the coat. No smutting on body or neck.

White markings can be extensive. Mane & tail are usually black or dark brown & frosting maybe present.

Silver: Silver/ white/pale cream colouring with a pale fawn/cream /brown mane & tail, Fawn to light brown leg colouring starts lower down the leg than usual often below the knee.



* **INDIRA:** Golden Buckskin

the buckskin family. It is often referred to as 'Smokey or brown buckskins. To determine if a true black dilute, parting the hair will usually reveal a dark smoky undercoat. A genetic test will determine dilute status.

DUN—Come in four categories, red, yellow, taffy & black. The overall body colour is a duller shade & often has a smutty appearance. They have minimal iridescence & usually a prominent dorsal stripe, face mask & leg barring known as primitive markings, these are the same colour as the mane & tail.

GRULLA- Body colour usually described as mouse, blue or slate colouring, with dark sepia to black points. This colour is flat & has no sheen or gloss, dappling & iridescence is rare as is white markings. They predominantly have strong primitive markings.
